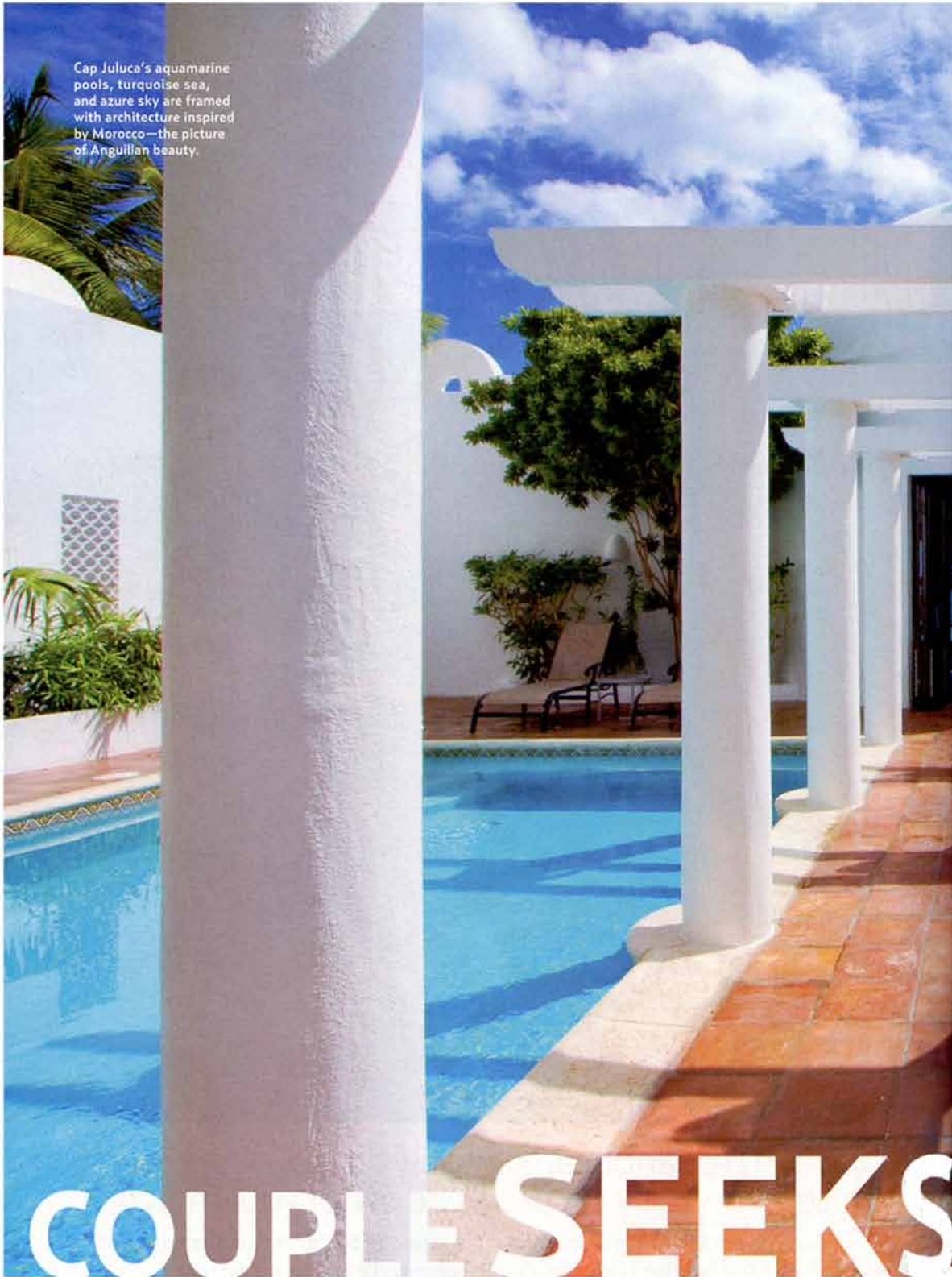


# BRIDES

Cap Juluca's aquamarine pools, turquoise sea, and azure sky are framed with architecture inspired by Morocco—the picture of Anguillian beauty.



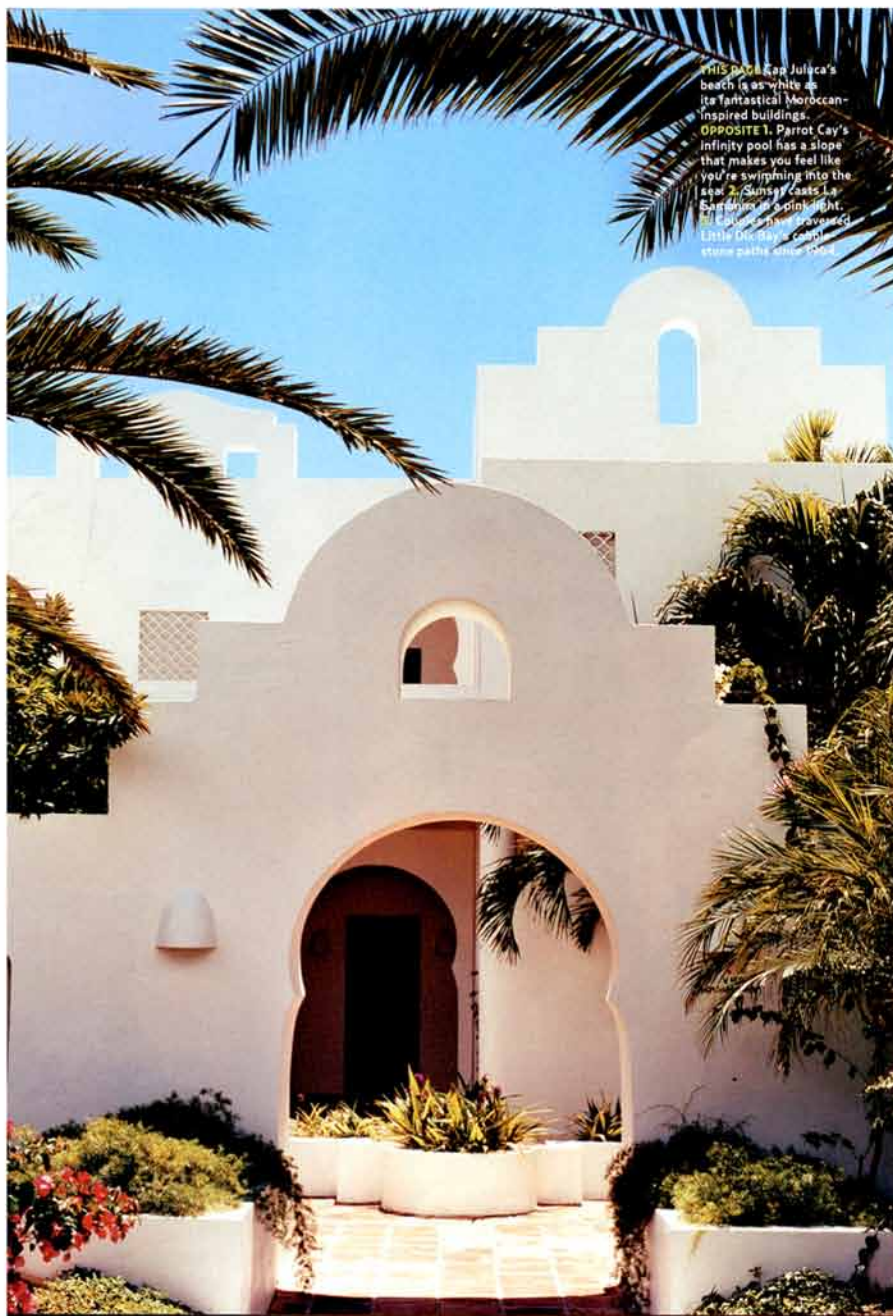

\$\$\$ CAP JULUCA, ANGUILLA This gated hotel, situated on a secluded stretch of powdery shoreline, feels as posh and private as can be. Take a cue from the A-listers who stay here by requesting in-room check-in and ordering breakfast in bed for the next morning, and don't emerge until you're ready to throw on a giant pair of sunglasses and stroll into the surf. (Afterward, flag down one of the walkie-talkie-toting butlers who run up and down the beach, offering towels and taking drink orders.) It's tough to tell who needs the R&R regimen more:



**WHO YOU ARE** Your screen saver: a hammock strung between palm trees by the sea. Your daydream: the scent of coconut oil and the warmth of the rays on your skin. You can't imagine why some people say they get bored after a few days of sunning by the surf—to you, the perfect afternoon activity is falling asleep on a lounge chair with a book on your face.

**WHERE TO GO** Consider Anguilla, where the sand is fine, the water is pale, and the tony Cap Juluca resort puts you within footsteps of the sea. Wake up with the sun, slip into your suits, and run into the waves. (Who needs coffee when the cool Caribbean sea is the world's best eye-opener?) Alternate between splashing in the froth and sunning on the shore, sipping frozen drinks, and rubbing each other with sunscreen. You can order breakfast, lunch, drinks, and even dinner from your lounge chairs—but then you'd miss viewing the moonrise

through the arches of your *Arabian Nights*-inspired suite. Doubles from \$425, including breakfast (low season); capjuluca.com.

**DON'T MISS** Throw on a cover-up for a trip to Scilly Cay, a restaurant on a small isle just off the coast. Park your rental car by the pier in Island Harbour, turn toward Scilly and wave your arms, and you'll soon see stick-figure people making their way toward you by motorboat. The price of

lunch includes the boat ride and an afternoon on the private shore; go for a snorkel with the turtles before splurging on satay-topped grilled lobster washed down with powerful rum punch.

**TAILOR-MADE FOR YOU** Smokey's restaurant is right on the beach at Cove Bay, so you can let the sea wash over your bare feet as you dine on jerk chicken and conch fritters. Groove to the reggae mix and share a coconut tart at sunset.—*Sherri Eisenberg*
